Unveiling God's Truth

Take notes as you read the Scripture each day. Reflect on the verses and apply them to your life.

Day 1—Read Matthew 19:16-30. ➤

- What do you think was the true motive of the rich young man in this story?
- How interested are you in gaining eternal life? Do you consider eternity to be a priority for you or just something you will deal with later?

Day 2—Read Matthew 20:1-16. ➤

- What truths are taught in this parable?
- Do you think God was fair in His dealings with the all-day workers? What about the eleventh-hour workers?
- Write a short paragraph thanking God for showing you mercy and grace and not justice.

Day 3—Read Matthew 20:17-28. ➤

- From these verses, we can clearly see that Jesus understood that His life was soon going to end at the hands of others. However, the key to understanding this passage is found in verse 28. Write a prayer of thanksgiving, thanking Jesus for giving His life as a ransom for you. Make thanking Him a priority in your life.

Day 4—Read Matthew 20:29-34. ➤

- Jesus asked the two blind men what they wanted Him to do. How does this apply to your life? What do you want Jesus to do for you? Write down your request in your journal. Make taking your request to Him first a priority in your life.

Day 5—Read Matthew 21:1-17. ➤

- What is the main action taking place in these verses? Is worship easy or hard for you?
- What advantage did these people have in worshipping Jesus that we do not have? What advantage do we have that these people could not know?
- How can worship become a priority in your life?

Day 6—Read Matthew 21:18-22. ➤

- What time of day did this incident happen? Why did Jesus approach the fig tree in the first place?
- Jesus obviously had not had breakfast and was looking to the fig tree for nourishment. This shows that Jesus experienced the same physical needs as any of us. Are physical needs like food and sleep a priority in your life?

Day 7—Read Matthew 21:23-27. ➤

- Truth was a priority for Jesus, not trying to trap people with clever questions. Which is your priority: knowing the truth or outsmarting someone?
- How does this passage affect your life?
